THE LABOR QUESTION,

In the 20 years ending with 1900 Carroll D. Wright United States Commissioner of labor 17 the 16 Annual Report in writing the number of days lost by wage loss of employes by lest time by reas'n of strikes during the 20 years under review at \$357,863. 
