SINK ANOTHER SHIP.

Russian Vladivostock Squadron Sinks a Merchant Ship--Name is Unknown.

Tokio, July 24.—The Russian Vladivostock squadron has sunk a merchant man which it captured off the coast of Izo province today. The name of this ship and her nationality is not known and nothing has been learned of the fate of her crew. Witnesses ashore saw the merchantman following the fleet. Then they saw her fired upon, after which she disappeared. The Russian warships were last reported at 11 o'clock to the southwest of Cape Iro, Izo province, steering to the west.
