Navies of The World.

The Scientific American of July 30th gives the following figures showing the relative strength of the navies of the world in tons:

Great Britain now has 1,516,040 tons of warships and 351,210 tons being constructed.

France comes second with a present navy of 576,108 tons and 179,647 under construction.

Germany ranks third with 387,874 of warships afloat and 117,735 tons in building.

Russia is fourth in rank with 346,458 tons now in service and 142,274 tons in preparation.

The United States now holds fifth rank with 294,405 tons of warships in use and 321,870 in process of construction.

Italy ranks sixth with 258,838 tons of warships afloat and 70,421 tons in construction.

Japan stands number seven with 243,585 tons of navy afloat and 10,095 tons in construction.

It will be seen from the above that there are now afloat 2,523,309 tons of ships used for warships and that when the ships now in construction are completed the tonnage will be 3,817,579 tons.

WANT REDUCTION IN PACIFIC RATES

Chicago Ill., Aug. 1.—It is the prevailing opinion that the recent change in rates and being centers on the part of the northern lines, whereby the rates from Chicago and the middle west were shifted for the benefit of the manufacturers east of this city will be duplicated by the roads operating from Chicago to the Pacific coast.

It now develops that other transcontinental lines have been importuned by trans-Missouri river retailers and jobbers to reduce freight rates generally from points east of Chicago and change the basing rate to New York. This would mean a general change in rates from points east of the Missouri River to Pacific coast territory.

City Jail Empty

Pendleton Aug. 1.—The escape of three prisoners from the city jail yesterday afternoon was followed during the night by five more gaining their freedom. The prison is now empty and City Marshal M. J. Carney declares that the city must repair the old jail or build a new one if he is expected to hold prisoners. "I might lessen the danger of losing prisoners," he said, "by locking them in the cells all the time. All of the eight men who got away from the jail were minor offenders and little effort is being made to apprehend them."

P. C. Murphy, serving sentence for drunkenness and awaiting trial for resisting an officer, Mat Murray and George Christie, two vagrants, were the three men to break jail yesterday afternoon. They gained their freedom by tearing up the stool in the closet, and crawling out underneath the floor. Sometime during the night the remaining five got away through the hole made by the others. The inmates that escaped last night are: Tom Sloan, Charles Wheeler, J. G. Warren and James Lamont serving time for drunkenness, and a Welch, a vagrant.
