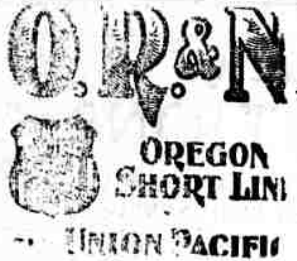

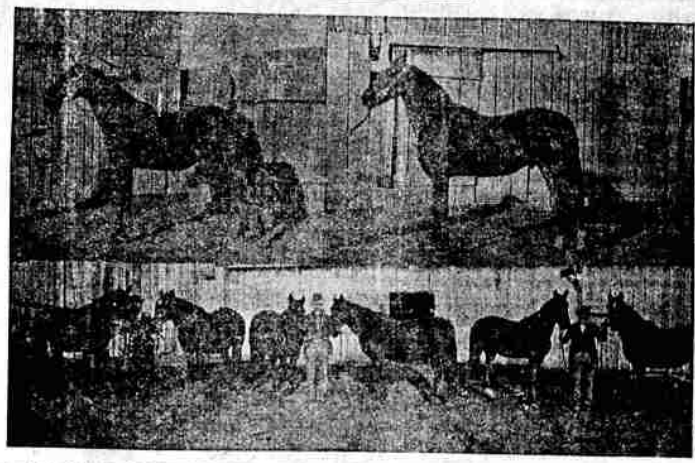

ALL OLD PATRONS

Pacific States Telephone Co. Renew Nearly all Subscription

The Pacific States Co. have concluded their canvass of the business Phones for renewal subscriptions at the standard rates signing up practically all the old subscribers. They have also secured a large proportion of the residence subscribers, and expect to put on the remaining residence patrons in the next few days.

As the party residence patrons have the best end of the proposition, inasmuch as the most radical improvements are to be made in that part of the service, while there is only twenty five cents difference in the rate, it is unlikely that there will be any exception to the signing up by the new service.

The situation practically assures the installation of the new service and the telephone patrons are to be congratulated on securing a modern conversation system superior to that of any metropolitan city in the West.

Injunction Permanent

Belleville Ill, Aug 1—The temporary injunction granted last week on application of the packers of the East St. Louis retaining the striking employees from interfering with the operation of the plants and men at work there was this afternoon made permanent by Judge Holder. Last week the strikers asked to have the injunction dissolved.

Letter from Andree

Christiana, Norway, Aug 1.—Dispatches received here report that a Norwegian whaler has found north of Spitzbergen a letter from Professor Andree dated 1898. The text of the letter is not disclosed. Professor Andree left Spitzbergen on a balloon July 11, 1897 with the intention of crossing the north pole. He has not been definitely heard from since.

PLANTS WORKING AT KANSAS CITY

Kansas City, August 2.—All the five packing houses resumed operations here today on an increased scale. The strikers remained away from the plants and everything was quiet.

Several hundred strikers presented themselves at the several plants and asked to be put to work. Between two and three were employed. All the packers asserted now they had full forces at work.

Cholera and Plague.

Washington Aug. 2.—About 30 cases of bubonic plague were being reported from Hongkong, while Asiatic cholera has also made its appearance at that point.

The latter is considered a source of great danger to the Philippines, and instructions for the most rigid quarantine examination have been issued to the islands.

LAST WORD FROM ANDREE.

Christiana Aug. 2.—A Norwegian whaler has found north of Cape Spitzbergen a bottle containing a letter from Arne August Andree dated 1898. The text is not given, but the document will be regarded with great interest, as it is probably the last communication that will ever be had from the unfortunate and daring explorer whose attempt to reach the north pole in a balloon attracted world-wide attention.

NEW TELEPHONE COMPANY

The Vergere Telephone Company is going to put in a telephone exchange in La Grande if two hundred or more people will sign contracts for telephones and the prices and service will be better than have ever been offered to La Grande people before. This company will have no party lines but every phone will be strictly private and on a private line. The price will be \$1.50 per month for business or office phones and \$1.00 per month for residence phones, and this rental will give connection with all the company's lines in the valley without extra charge. It is to say, Elgin and Summerville and all intermediate points including farmers' lines now in active use will be connected up with the exchange at once, and the eight other farmers' lines now projected will be connected with the exchange as soon as they are completed. The local exchange will also have the free use of the McCully lines into the Wallowa valley and
