Director of speakers' bureau, western headquarters—James A. Tawney, Minnesota.
The chairman, secretary, treasurer and sergeant at arms of the national committee are also the officers of the executive committee.

DEMOCRATS NAME KERN FOR GOV.

Indianapolis, Ind., August 4.—The

Democratic state convention was called to order at Tomlinson hall at 11 o'clock this morning. The convention will nominate candidates for governor, lieutenant governor, secretary of state, treasurer of state, auditor, attorney-general, reporter of the supreme court, state statistician, superintendent of public instruction and two judges of the supreme court.

For governor, John W. Kern of Indianapolis was chosen by acclamation, and for lieutenant governor, Wardner Stevens.

The platform adopted omits all mention of gold, and endorses Parker and Davis and the St. Louis platform.
