Idaho Democrats Af-Platform Regarding Mormonism.

Lewiston Aug. 16-It was made clear by this morning that it would be impossible for Dubois to secure from the Democratic state convention such Mormon plank as had been planned and attention was then turned to a compromise. The northern counties in a measure took the matter out of the hands of the senator and Heitfeld. Their disposition was to go no farther than reiserate the plank of the national, platform but they were willing to support something more of a conservative nature if the two leaders should insist upon it. 
