In 1903 the foreign trade of Canada was, imports \$224,814,-000 worth of stuffs, and exports to the amount of \$196,161,000 showing purchases in excess of sales to the amount of \$28,653,oco that year.

In the year 1903 C-nada exported to the United States \$123,472,416 worth of stuffs, and imported from the United States \$54,660,410 worth of things.

The people of Canada are not as well supplied with money as are the people of the United States. The stock of money in Canada at close of 1903 gave a per capita of 17.85, while the per capita in the United States at that time was 29.47.

Both Canada and the United States ase gold, silver and paper money but gold is the basis of value. The per capita of gold in Canada at close of 1903 was TIMBER LAND, ACT JUNE 3, 1878-\$6.19, of silver 1.23 and of paper money 10.43 making a per capita

In the U S at close of 1903 there was gold per capita in the U S of 15.55, a silver one of \$.21 and a paper one of 5.71 making a total money per capita of 29.47. 8.21 and a paper one of 5.71 W of 29, 47.

For the eleven moths ending Registration with May 1904 the United States exported to Canada. 117,698 939 worth of stuffs and for the same time bought from her 45,596 212 and for the same time we purchased from Newfoundland and Labador 1,062,953 worth and Gold thereto 2,393,110

The people of Canada are so similar to us, and their habits and skill litele different from us that they produce and sell about the same things we do, and purchase about the same kind of stuff that we do. They rear horses, cattle, and sheep on their cheaper lands then ours h t have longer winters.

During the eleven months ending with May 1904 we purth s. 2,770 horses from Canada for 618,415 for the same time we bought of Canada 1,226.525 tons of numerous coal for 3,138, 624 and at the same time our purchasers of corper from Cauada were 226,765 worth Anothe
