NO TRAINS AT LOS ANGELES

Los Angeles Aug. 30—For the first time since there have been two railroads built into Los Angeles from the east there were no overland trains in or out of the city today.

Traffic on the Southern Pacific is at a standstill, owing to the washing out of the track on the desert yesterday between Beaumont and El Casco. Three miles of track was carried out and traffic will not be resumed before tomorrow.

The effect of the water at the scene of the cloudburst yesterday was terrific, and 80 pound steel rails were twisted and broken and carried considerable distances from their original resting places.

Considerable stock was drowned, county bridges carried away and roads washed out.

ALASKA CABLE IS IN PLACE

Seattle Wash. Aug. 30—Amid the cheering of 300 men and women, the shrieking of whistles, and the playing of national anthem, the final splicing of the Seattle-Sitka government cable was made at 3:30 this afternoon in the harbor 10 miles out of this city. Ten minutes later Mayor Ballinger of Seattle cut the ropes holding the jointed ends of the cable ship Burnside, and with a splash the completed cable fell to the bottom of Puget sound, and the work of months on the part of the sig-

nal corps of the United States army was completed.

Great Textile Strike

Fall River, Mass. Aug. 30—The sixth week of the textile strike involving 26,000 employes was ushered in today. There are no more indications of a resumption of operations than when the bitter contest began and the strike has so far cost the workers \$800,000 in wages and they have spent \$50,000 from their treasury. It is learned that southern manufacturers are securing much business hitherto handled by the local mills and the manufacturers are becoming uneasy as a consequence.
