Their Disappointment

St Petersburg, Sept. 6.—The feeling of national grief and disappointment over general Kuropatkin's unsuccessful attempt to make a stand at Liao Yang, is deep and bitter as it is, is somewhat tempered by the fact that the Russian commander removed his stores northward before the battle, leaving a mere shell at Liao Yang, and that he has succeeded in extricating his army, especially general Stackelberg's corps from the clutches of the Japanese. The war office here believes that the battle is virtually ended and that Kuropatkin's line of retreat is open. While admitting that Kuropatkin sustained a severe defeat the war office considers the failure of field marshal Oyama to cut off Kuropatkin a strategic defeat for Oyama. They figure that Oyama had a numerical superiority of 60,000 men in his operations against Kuropatkin.

The officials do not expect a renewal of the fighting for several days which they think the Japanese will employ in recuperating while Kuropatkin collects his army preparatory to pushing northward. According to military authorities all of Kuropatkin's hopes and plans of victory were dashed by the wonderful celerity with which Oyama's right pushed northward after crossing the Taitse river. The war office professes ignorance of losses of guns and men on the part of the Russians but have no doubt that many thousands have fallen. The retreat of Kuropatkin has evidently thrown everything into confusion at the front, and reports are meager and incomplete. The emperor has taken Kuropatkin's defeat greatly to heart. But the preservation of the army organization is a great relief and his answer to battle Liao Yang will be the mobilization of two more army corps. There is not the slightest suggestion of yielding here. The cry of the papers is that the war must go on until Russia is victorious, if not this year, then next year.

The Funeral

The funeral of the late John R Kellogg took place today from the Methodist church, Rev. J C Walker officiating. The G A R attended in a body. The house was crowded to pay their respects to the old pioneer. The interment was in the I O O F cemetery.
