As this is filed, the correspondent of the associated press can hear the beeming of the Japanese guns, fourteen miles from Mukden.

Out as much of the flesh off the head as possibleant work the brain out the hole at back of head Save the under jaw bones hold drying the skin keep it from wrinkling.
