## Still Retreating.

St Petersburg, Sept 8.—The authorities now believe the danger of Field Marshal Oyama cutting off Kuropatkin is practically passed. The whole Russian army will probably reach Mukden tomorrow night. Kuropatkin have been marching north along parallel lines both armies greatly hampered by the heavy roads. The Japanese are in a rough region and the Russians along the flat country but they are embarrassed by the high Chinese corn. There is constant fighting at the Russian rear and along the eastern wing but nothing of importance has occurred since the retreat began. Kuropatkin's intentions regarding Mukden probably depend on the Japanese. There is considerable evidence that if Kuropatkin is compelled to move on he will make a stand at Tieling where the Russians wintered last year. Tieling is 40 miles north of Mukden and easily defended.

## Carrier Pigeon Freed

A homing pigeon, belong to Mr Sam Williams of the Dalles, was today brought to La Grande by Master Joe Whitty, who brought the carrier bird to the Observer office to turn it free for its long flight home. At exactly 10:54 A M the pigeon was set at liberty. Immediately it started circling, avoiding the telegraph and telephone wires, and getting higher made two circles and then started due west on its long and weary flight to its home.
