Many View Curios

Last month was a record breaker in point of attendance at the museum of the Oregon Historical society, in the city hall, at Portland. During that time 1,918 visitors registered. This does not include all who visited the museum, for many viewed the old curios without writing their names on the register. Of the total number who registered 570 were out of town people and these came from 36 states of the union. There were also five different foreign countries represented, with a total of 27 visitors. Visitors from 145 towns of Oregon were among the number who viewed the old curiosities.

The museum is attracting unusual attention, especially from the Oregonians. Here they find an abundance of material to interest them. There are quaint, and once useful, articles used by the men and women who crossed the continent to make their homes among the wilds of this state. There are also many old articles from foreign countries. One of the finest collections of Indian relics in this part of the country is also on exhibition in the museum.

The rooms are located on the fourth floor of the city hall and are open every day from 1 to 5 o'clock in the afternoon, excepting Sundays and holidays, and visitors are always made welcome.
