A N Oliver has shipped 12 car loads of timothy so far this season to Portland and has orders for as much more just as soon as he can secure the cars.

Hay dealers report a great surplus of hay in the valley this year and that about one half of the crop will be shipped out which will find a remunerative market for the better grades.

A V Oliver expects a car load of alfalfa seed to arrive from Utah next month. Each year our farmers are growing more and more alfalfa and under proper conditions it is certainly a profitable crop.

H. A. Watson was in the city Saturday from Alice and stated that the beet harvest would begin there Tuesday. Mr. Watson has charge of the company beet fields in the vicinity of Alice, about five hundred acres. He states that he will furnish work for next six weeks to all who will apply to him.

One of the largest ore shoots discovered in recent years has been entered on the mines of the Standard Consolidated Mines Co. in the Quartzburg district. On the lower level of the Standard mine an ore body has been disclosed and clearly defined for sixty feet. The ore is good playing ore and work on the face is being pressed with c.w. shifts.

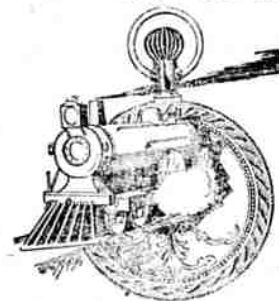
