RUSSIAN CRUISER AT SAN FRANCISCO

Japanese Ask that the Lena be Removed in Twenty-four Hour Limit.

Washington, Sept. 13.—The expected protest of Japan against allowing the Russian auxiliary cruiser Lena, which arrived at San Francisco yesterday, to remain longer than twenty-four hours came today.

After a conference with the commissioner of navigation, Acting Secretary Murray of the department of commerce and labor, sent this dispatch to the collector.

"Wire the department at the hour of the steamer's arrival at San Francisco and a concise resume of the steamer inspector's report, and if repairs are necessary, the probable time required to make them."

CONSIDER AFFAIR SERIOUS
 San Francisco, Sept. 13.—No representative of the United States government has been at the Russian converted cruiser Lena for the purpose

of substantiating the claims of Captain Perilsky that the warship put in port solely for the reason that her boilers were in such condition as to render her absolutely unseaworthy. The Russian warship has now remained in port long over the twenty-four hour limit and prominent members of local Russian and Japanese colonies are evincing great interest in what they are prone to designate a serious "complication."

United States Inspector of Hulls and Boilers, Balger, will make a thorough inspection of her boilers and as soon as possible submit a report to Collector of Port Stratton. Upon this report may depend whether or not the Lena is ordered to put to sea immediately or whether she is allowed to remain in such time as repairs are deemed necessary to be made.

Factory Notes
 Beet digging begins today.
 Mr. Bramwell, the field Superintendent, has wagered a new hat that some of the fields in Union will average over twelve and a half to a per acre.

Plowing has begun on the 1200 acre farm bought by the Sugar company in Union. A large portion of the farm will be planted with beets next year. Eli Matt will take charge of the farm.

Mr Nichols, who sold his farm has gone to Mexico to look up the cane sugar industry. His former partner, Mr. Weaver, will harvest this year over 10,000 tons of cane sugar.

A large tank for storing syrup is being built at the factory. With the new tanks bought and the expensive improvements being made it looks quite certain that the La Grande factory is a permanent fixture to our valley.

All the harness for the year's run will be installed next Saturday.

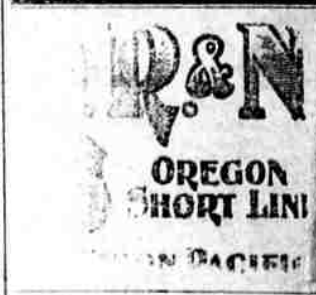
