Reno Nevada, Sept. 13—Two passenger trains, one running at a speed of twenty-five miles an hour collided on an open curve near Laughton's Springs at noon today. As a result the fireman and coal passer are dead. Twenty-five were injured. The wreck was caused by a misunderstanding of orders on the part of the engineer of one of the trains and a wrong signal given by the operator at Laughton's.
