
New Amusement House

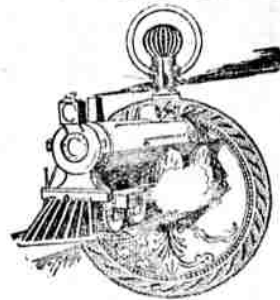
