## ROOSEVELT TO TRY NEW YORK

Washington, Oct. 7.—Ex-Lieutenant Governor Woodruff, of New York, and William Berry, proprietor of the Brooklyn Standard Union, were guests of President Roosevelt today at luncheon. Mr. Woodruff came to Washington on the invitation of the president.

As he was leaving the White House Woodruff said to a representative of the Associated Press:

"It would not be proper for me to disclose the details of our conference, but I may say it related to the general political situation with particular reference to New York state.

"I think there is no doubt but that Roosevelt will carry New York state by a substantial plurality.

## Three Warships Ordered

Copenhagen, Oct. 10.—It is reported that Russia has ordered a Danish firm to construct three warships for delivery after the Russo-Japanese war. They will cost 40,000,000 kroner.

## Money in United States

The Observer received Monday morning the Circulation statement from the Treasury Department of the United States, showing that on October 1, 1904, there were \$2,835,333,734 in stock in the United States of which \$273,184,245 were held in the United States Treasury as assets of the government, leaving \$2,562,149,489 in circulation among the people, a gain of \$157,530,420 since October 1, 1903.

On Oct. 1, 1904, the Treasury Department estimated the population of the United States at 82,214,000 and the per capita circulation at \$31.10 an increase in per capita circulation of \$3.10 since 1901.

The circulation of money among the people in the United States is now greater than ever before. In 1860 at the end of 60 years of Democratic rule the per capita was \$13.85. The first year of Cleveland's last Administration the circulation per capita was \$24.03 and the last year, 1896 it was \$21.41 a loss of \$2.63 per capita.

## A Brave Man

St Petersburg Oct. 10.—One of the first acts of Prince Sviatopolk Mirsky after assuming the office of minister of the interior was to discharge with three months salary ninety detectives who had been Minister Pleh's personal body guard. In explanation the minister said that on account of his health he should do much walking and he did not propose to be annoyed by a continual shadowing.

## Sues for Divorce.

Seattle Oct. 10.—Henry B Beecher, on of the late Henry Ward Beecher, the noted pulpit orator, and nephew of Harriet Beecher Stowe, the author of "Uncle Tom's Cabin" has instituted divorce proceedings in the superior court of this county against his wife, Mrs H B Beecher of Brooklyn N Y. The ground alleged is desertion for five years.

## Sweet Marie Wins

Lexington, Ky, Oct. 8.—Kentucky's greatest turf event the Trar-Tylvania with \$5000 was won by Sweet Marie yesterday in three straight heats. The winner is owned by William Garrison of Los Angeles. Summary: The Trar-Tylvania, purse \$5000 2:12 trotting, three in five—Sweet Marie won the third, fourth and fifth heats in 2:05, 2:08 1/2, 2:09. Tiverton won first and second in 2:05 1/2, 2:04 1/2. Hall Fry, Snyder McGregor, Knox's Gelatine King, Tuna and Kent also started.

Chicago Oct. 10.—The national republican committee today recognized La Follette's faction in Wisconsin by its offer to send Fairbanks and other speakers to the state under its direction.

## Killed by Train

Mr C B Jeffries, brother of Iven Jeffries who for some time was book-keeper for the Stoddard Lumber Co., was killed Friday at Glenn's Ferry Idaho. C B Jeffries was head brakeman on the Huntington and Glenn's Ferry Division of the O S L and was crushed to death between two freight cars.

## Ten Years for \$40

Walla Walla, Oct. 10.—Dr. Otto A. Martin, a prominent physician of Tacoma, yesterday began a 10 years' sentence at the state penitentiary for embezzlement of \$40, confined to his care by a school teacher of Eatonville, where he was clerk of the school board.

## Eighteen Men Entombed

Berlin, Oct. 7.—A coal mine collapsed at Gerlebough in Unhalt today and 18 miners are entombed.

Every available man of the force, which numbers more than 1,000 men, is being worked in the effort to rescue the prisoners. It is believed they may have survived immediate death in open chambers situated near the cave-in.
