# Torpedo Boats Loaded

Newport News Va Oct.—Two of the Lake submarine torpedo boats built in the shipyards here and believed to be destined for the Japanese and Russian governments, were hoisted on board the Kennebec today, according to the foreman in charge. Two hundred men were engaged in loading the craft. The Kennebec will sail for Boston before daylight. It is stated on apparently good authority tonight that the Kennebec will be met up the coast by a steamship now lying far at sea and the big floating derrick, the Ox, from New York. The Ox, it is asserted, will lift the submarines from the deck of the Kennebec and transfer them to the waiting steamer, which will proceed with the torpedo boats to its destination.
