JAPS

TO USE AIRSHIP

Will Sail Over Fleets and Forts and Drop Dynamite—Arranging with inventor

St. Louis, Nov. 1.—The Republican today says: Dr. August Greth, of San Francisco, inventor and navigator of the airship Calor-la Eagle, which has repeatedly made successful trips has received a proposal through the representatives of the Japanese government and if arrangements are perfected as suggested, his craft will be shipped to the Orient to be used in exploding dynamite and other high explosives over the ships of the Russian fleet and over the cities and forts within the circle of hostilities. Dr. Greth who is in St. Louis, said:

"These men of whom I speak are well known figures in the commercial world, and have a very close connection with the diplomatic affairs of their country. They visit me at my workshop and laboratory in San Francisco and I thoroughly demonstrated to them that my airship is practicable for the purpose desired, and made a complete test of the apparatus for their benefit.

"I have perfected a mechanism which provides for the firing of 25 pounds of dynamite or nitro glycerine, and is so constructed that correct aim and range can be secured as easily and successfully as if we had on board our sky cruiser one of the navies big guns with a well trained crew of men to work it. In case I go to the front this mechanism will form a part of my equipment."
