Will Sail Over Fleets and Forts and Drop Dynamite---Arranging with Inventor

St. Louis, Nov. 1. -The Republican today says: Dr. August Greth, of San Francisco, inventer and navigator of the airship Califor, in Eagle, which has repeatedly made successful trips has received a proposal through the representatives of the Japanese gov ernment and if arrangements are per feeted as suggested, his craft will be shipped to the Orient to be used in exploding dynamite and other high ex plosives over the ships of the Russian fleet and over the cities and forts within the circle of hestilities.
