BURNED TEN SLOT MACHINES

Boise Idaho Nov 3.—The raid on the slot machines that pay money has resulted the last few days in burning 10 of them, said to be valued at \$500 each. Three captured at the Star were burned yesterday. Today seven secured in the house of a man named Morris, who with Jack Mullen, is said to own all the machines brought here, were burned. Morris said the seven burned were worth \$3500.

Eleven machines were seized several days ago and an effort was made to replevin them from the justice of the peace who issued the warrant for the seizure. That effort led to a row in the court room of the justice between the sheriff, constable and deputy county attorney. The trouble was adjusted by an agreement to await the return of Judge Stewart to vote upon the right to replevin such machines, and 11 machines are still held by a committee representing both interests.

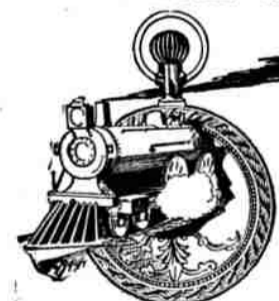

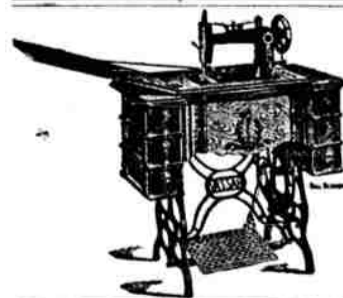
