

La Grandes Big Debt

Business Men Asked to Consider the Tax Proposition From a Common Sense View

In Friday's Observer appears an article signed by 97 men. The heading is misleading as the list has names of a number who neither own nor operate

any business in La Grande. The plea is made that taxes will be increased if saloons are prohibited. Let us see how these men are taxed and how it will affect them. The county taxes are \$167,656 00. The men signing the article pay \$8909.34. 28 of these men pay no taxes, 20 of them pay less than \$20. 2 men who pay over one fourth of the amount are not residents of La Grande. The above figures are for the city and county taxes. These 97 men only pay an average of \$17 city tax while 48 of them do not average \$2 apiece. We have no contention with business men because they have little to tax, but let voters know that the list does not represent the tax payers of La Grande. It is believed that some business men signed under a misapprehension. If so, they should say so in a very public way.

Lower Taxes

"You will increase your taxes if you

vote for the saloons" Let us see if this argument hold good? In Mass. where 13 of her 33 cities are without saloons and have been from 1 to 16 years trustworthy data may be obtained.

It is of passing interest to notice that Cambridge, Mass., with a population of 91,886, which has been without saloons for fifteen years, has a tax rate of 18.3 mills; while Dayton O., with a population of 85,333, a large supply of saloons and an assortment of breweries, has a tax rate of 25.4 mills. Somerville, Mass., population 61,646, no saloons, has a tax rate of 16.4 and Akron, O., population 42,728, conspicuous for its supply of saloons and brewery equipment, has a tax rate of 28.2 mills.

Newton, Mass., population, 33,587 without saloons for years, has a tax rate of 16.4 mills; and Springfield, O., population 38,258, rather priding itself on its beer production, and perhaps, consumption, has a tax rate of 23.5 mills.

The tax question, from the liquor standpoint, is simply a bluff.

La Grande is in debt \$100,000 say those who oppose county prohibition. What an admission! With 12 to 18 saloons paying in one with 12 gambling outfits paying until recently regular fines—with a row of bawdy houses paying their fines still in debt \$100,000.

Would it not be wise to go dry awhile and pay our debts and get some improvements?

DOLLARS OR PEOPLE?

The one argument of the advocates of saloons is that they save money to tax payers. If this were true—whol, it is not—would it pay to sacrifice boys, men, women and innocent babes to save a few dollars? Can't we see a boy behind a dollar? Some can and will say so next Tuesday.
