First Engine to

Stanford University is placing in its museum the first locomotive to cross the continent from the Pacific coast. It is named the Governor Stanford No. This engine was built in the early 60's and was shipped from the east around Cape Horn in 1867. After the driving of the golden spike, the last act of the completion of the Central Pacific road, on May 10 1869, this engine was used by Governor Stanford to draw his private train through Nevada to the scene of the exercises.
The Central Pacific presented the engine to the university several years ago, and it has been stored in a shed on the university campus, but it is now to be given a permanent place in the museum and to be polished and made to appear as nearly as possible as it did when it was in use.
