

LANDS OPENED NEAR SHOSHONE

The Shoshone Falls Project Should Not be Confused with Shoshone Project in Wyoming

"Since the recent throwing open to settlers of the lands near Shoshone Falls, Idaho, which are to be irrigated by the big Twin Falls canal system, a large number of inquiries have been received from persons who had confused this with the 'Shoshone project of Wyoming,' says A. W. Hadley of the National Irrigation association. 'The Twin Falls proposition, south of Shoshone Falls, is what is known as a Carey act project in which the

settlers are required to pay 50 cents per acre for the land and a certain amount for perpetual water right in the canal. The 50 cents (paid in two instalments) goes to the state, and the price of the water right, which in this case is \$25 per acre, is paid to the company building the canal. The settler, and he must be a bona fide one, will pay in this instance 25 cents an acre upon making application to the state and \$3 an acre for water th

first two seasons. The second payment of 25 cents for the land may be paid at any time during the next three years upon acquiring title and the balance of the \$25 for water will be paid in annual instalments of from \$2 to \$4 per acre.

PRIVATE COMPANY'S BIG PLAN
"This is the largest irrigation proposition yet promoted by a private corporation and embraces more than 470,000 acres in Cassia county lying on the south side of Snake river. The system includes a 50 foot dam and more than 70 miles of huge canal. The total cost is estimated at \$2,500,000.

"In the same locality with the Twin Falls project is the government Minidoka proposition which is also being considerably confused with the Wyoming scheme on account of its being erroneously spoken of as the Shoshone. The Minidoka project will include at least 120,000 acres on both sides of the Snake river, and under the provisions of the national irrigation law is open to actual settlers only, who must reside upon their tract for five consecutive years before acquiring absolute title to the same.

"The great Shoshone project of Wyoming has now been appropriated or (\$2,500,000) and is destined to prove one of the most gigantic schemes yet contemplated by the reclamation service. The Shoshone river, named in Indian language 'Stinking river' so named on account of its sulphurous origin among the Yellowstone springs rises near the boundary of Yellowstone national park in northwestern Wyoming and flows eastward through a canyon cut deeply through solid granite.

"It is in this canyon that the great dam will be built. It will be a wonderful piece of cement and stone masonry, joining the precipitous sides of the canyon like a huge triangle 140 feet long on top and the point of the triangle extending downward 170 feet and disappearing into the river. An immense lake or reservoir will be thus formed which will cover 3300 acres of land and will store 7,000,000,000 cubic feet of water.

A GREAT STORAGE PROJECT
"The Shoshone river has a flow which is highly variable carrying in time of flood as much as 10,000 cubic feet per second, and during the dry season dropping to as low as 250. Hence the scheme will be strictly a storage one, the water of which will be led from the reservoir down onto the lands to be cultivated, through a system of tunnels and canals some four miles in length.

"A great power plant will be installed at the dam, and a contemplated 3000 horse power generated with an additional 4000 horse power generated from the waters of Eagle Nest creek not far distant. This power will be used as in other propositions for pumping water into several thousand acres more which are high to be covered by the gravity system.

"Those who have an idea of investigating the project with a view of taking up a homestead should bear in mind that all government land has been withdrawn under the provisions of the irrigation law and nothing but actual five year residence will suffice. The cost of constructing the dam and canals will be charged up to the settlers and must be paid back to the government in 10 annual instalments. No interest is charged however, and the homesteader can easily make his payments off from the proceeds of his land. Those who take up their tracts before the water is ready for use will be able to secure employment on the works without doubt. In fact the government desires in this way to keep the money at home by employing the local farmers in the valley that they may also become thoroughly familiar with the system and thereby be able to care for the same when it is finally turned over to the management of a local water users' association.
