"It is in this canyon that the great dam will be built. It will be a wonderful piece of cement and stone masony, joining the precipitous sides of the canyon like a huge triangle 140 feet long on top and the point of the triangle extending downward 170 feet add disappearing into the river. immense lake or reseavoir will be thus formed which will cover 3300 acres of land and will store 7,000,000,000 cubic feet of water.
