

SUPPOSED CORPSE COMES TO LIFE

San Jose, Cal., Nov. 9.—The sight of a morgue wagon driven madly through the streets of the city yesterday caused a commotion, and when the wagon pulled up in front of the police station a big crowd gathered. Suddenly the crowd melted away. Faces that a minute before were flushed from the exertions of their owners in following the dead wagon became blanched and knees knocked.

From the black wagon came uncanny sounds.

From a safe distance the people craned necks.

From inside came cries, "Let me out, let me out."

The black box was pulled out on the ground, the lid flew open and a set of arms and legs waved vigorously in the air for a moment and then the supposed corpse sat up while the crowd yelled.

Explanation showed that a woman called for a morgue wagon to come to the southern end of town to get a supposed corpse. A deputy found William Armiger lying in the road apparently dead, put him in the wagon and started for the morgue. Two blocks of the jolting roused the corpse and William set up a yell which terrified the deputy and started him in a gallop for the police station. It was just a case of two much old rye.

Lives Lost In Fire

Houston, Tex., Nov. 9.—As a result of the burning of the Silver Queen hotel in the Sour Lake oil field today four persons were burned to death and two fatally injured. The dead: O E Lewis, Los Hamilton, and John Smith and wife. The origin of the fire is unknown.

Found Not Guilty

Hillboro, Or Nov 9.—W D Zeigler of Gales Creek was yesterday given a hearing here on a charge of assault and battery committed on his father, who is 75 years of age. Several witnesses gave testimony for the plaintiff and defendant in the case but the jury promptly returned a verdict of "not guilty."

Shoots Himself

Spokane Nov. 9.—William Swezey, formerly a letter carrier in St Paul, committed suicide here yesterday by shooting himself. He came west last April on account of his health. He purchased the furniture and business of a hotel in Harrington. He later turned the business over to another party, spending the summer on the St. Marie's river.

On September 21 the hotel burned and one man was burned to death. Swezey came here at the beginning of October. He was arrested, charged with arson, the supposition being he burned the hotel to secure insurance. He was let out on \$1000 bail. He was in the last stages of consumption.

Os-te-op-a-ty
