Huntington W. Vs. Nov. 11-Sheriff Daniels of Fayette county and a prominent citizen of Montgomery was shot and killed today by Harvey Jackson in Montgomery a small hamlet near Fayetteville. Today's killing grew out of a quartel last night in which Policeman Will Elliott shot and killed Constable W A Jackson. Harvey Jackson a brother of W & Jackson and two other brothers are said to have armed themselves and sta ted out to "clean up" the entire police force of the town. Sheriff Daniels ordered Harvey Jack-on to leave town under penalty of being arrested. J ckson without a word shot the sheriff dead. John Bolff who saw the -booting threw up his hands and advanced to remonstrate with Jackson and to help Daniels. Jackson then shot Rolff dead. The three Jacksons have fled to the woods and a hun dred men are in pursuit.
