Origin of the Hansom.

The hansom was the invention of Joseph Hansom, the architect of the Birmingham town hall. But the two wheeled cab which he patented in 1834 little resembles the vehicle which now bears his name. It had a square, sedan chair shaped body hung between two wheels nearly eight feet high. The driver's seat was in front, no also was the door. The fare entered the cab between the wheel and shaft. The modern hansom was adapted from this original by Messrs. Gillet and Chapman. It is a peculiarly English vehicle, and no foreign nation has ever comprehended the dogged courage of the Briton who can sit calmly inside it. London Chronicle.

To Obtain a Slim Waist.

It's nice to be plump, but to be plump in the wrong place is misery. French women, though they get quite redundant, have their redundancy located properly owing to the training of their figures from girlhood. The best thing for a woman to do when she has allowed her "form to get out of form" is to regain it by taking gymnastic training of some kind, fencing or clubs or dumbbells. In the modern gymnasium there is such an apparatus for the waist--two great ropes from the ceiling terminate in a pair of padded metal rings, into which you slip your arms, and, poisoning your toes within the central disk on the floor, you swing yourself round and round in a circle, making your toes the pivot. It is splendid for indigestion, this apparatus, and for one's condition generally as well as one's figure. The action comes greatly from the waist, which should be the strongest part of the body and which by no means implies the thickest. The waist should be firm and in reason sleek.

The French Academy.

The French academy is one of the five academies and the most eminent constituting the Institute of France. It was founded in 1635 by Cardinal Richelieu and reorganized in 1810. It is composed of forty members, the new member elected by the remaining thirty-nine members for life after personal application and the submission of their nomination to the head of the state. It meets twice weekly at the palace Mazarin, 23 Quai Conti, Paris, and is "the highest authority on everything pertaining to the niceties of the French language--to grammar, rhetoric and poetry and the publication of the French classics." How to Cure Distemper.

CORRECT BREATHING.

How to Inhale and Exhale--Some Good Exercises.

The air in the bottom of many a pair of lungs is like the dead air in an unventilated cellar. A conscious effort must be made to expel the residual air at the base of the lungs for chest expansion, blood purification, radiant health and lasting beauty.
Deep breathing exercises, through the nostrils, never the mouth, should be practiced night and morning, says the New York News. Thorough respiration increases the red corpuscles of the blood and purifies the entire circulatory system.
Thorough respiration frees the lungs of the noxious carbon gas and bodily impurities thrown off in the form of watery vapor of the breath.
At least ten deep inhalations of fresh air should be taken upon or before rising every morning and the same before going to bed every night. These may be taken either in an upright or recumbent position.
If lying down, lie flat upon the back, arms extended, and slowly inhale through the nostrils. Try to fill every air cell of the lungs. The abdomen should rise first, then the chest, as the lungs become inflated. After holding the breath a little expel it slowly through the lips. Fill and empty the lungs as thoroughly as possible and try to realize that health, vitality, energy and beauty are in each incoming breath and impurity, weakness and disease are being discarded with every exhalation.
The breath is the life.

How to Clean Tortoise Shell.

Tortoise shell that has become dingy may be cleaned by wiping the article with a soft cloth, then rubbing well with a paste made of rotten stone and sweet oil, next applying jeweler's rouge and finally polishing with a piece of chamois. Treatment like this is not required often if shell pins and combs are polished frequently with
