IN MEMORY OF CHAS. F. BROWN

Steward's Opera House Was Filled with a Large Crowd, Yesterday, to Participate in the Services in Memory of Conductor Brown

Sunday afternoon the Opera House was filled with our citizens in response to the opportunity offered to be present at the memorial service of Conductor Charles F. Brown who was killed at Kamela on last Tuesday morning.

This memorial service was fitting. Mr. Brown until his last promotion was a resident of this city for several years and was held in the highest respect possible, by all who knew him. Words either written or spoken fail to give credit to the honor and esteem in which the sudden taking away of such a character and life as Chas. Brown was held among those who were his business or social companions. Acts however speak with emphasis. About four years ago the promotion of Mr. Brown necessitated his moving to Pendleton and during those four years his pure character so permeated that city that the press in speaking of his funeral chronicled it as the largest attended in their history. Thus bared with the highest possible honors by the citizens of his home, yet such a life and character was sufficient to demand and warrant a public memorial service in a city where he had not made his home for nearly four years.

The world admires and honors a pure character and such was the legacy of Chas. Brown.

"Abide with Me," one of the favorite songs of the deceased, was read by Rev. Edwin B. Hays, of the Presbyterian church, and led by the quartet. Duett, "I heard the voice of Jesus say," by Messrs. Davis and Ferrin.

THE ADDRESS

Dr. Palmer, of Portland, delivered the address taking his text from Hebrews 11:4 "He being dead, yet speaketh."

He dwelt upon the christian character of the deceased. His brilliant conversion, likening it unto Paul stepping out of darkness into light. A lover of his bible which was his constant companion.

Dr. Palmer paid a glowing tribute to his life and the monument he left to mankind.

The quartet sang "Asleep in Jesus" and the vast audience retired deeply impressed with the uncertainties of this life but the beauties of the life to come to all who follow in "His steps."
