**ODDFELLOW SAVED NEGRO**

**A Mob was About to Lynch Two Negroes when a Guard Called For a Brother Lodge Man**

Lexington, Ky., Nov 22—William Moore, a laboring man, was killed last night by three negroes who attacked the white man in a saloon without provocation. Jim Garfield and Ed Taylor, two of the negroes, were caught and lodged in jail. At midnight a crowd that had been gathering on the outskirts of the city became formidable and their intention to attack the jail to secure the negroes seemed certain. Policemen were stationed in and around the jail.

At 1 o'clock the mob, 300 strong moved on the jail. When within twenty squares of the prison a police picket halted the leader: "Is there an Odd-fellow in this crowd?" The crowd halted and the leader stepped forward. In a hurried conversation the policeman told him that 40 officers were in and around the jail and that an attack meant wholesale bloodshed. The leader returned to his fellows who were armed with firearms of all descriptions and within five minutes the mob had disappeared.

**Needs of Navy**  
Washington Nov. 22—Secretary of the navy Morton today gave out the estimates of appropriations necessary for the naval establishment the coming fiscal year. The total is \$114,530,038.34 as compared with \$99,158,191.04 appropriated for the present year. He asks \$280,000 for Mare Island navy yard, and \$385,500 for the Puget Sound yards.

**Inauguration Day**  
Washington Nov. 22—Already the people of the District of Columbia are looking forward to inauguration day, with its accompanying civic demonstration, and that most elaborate and popular of social functions, the inaugural ball. It is the intention of those concerned in the arrangements to make the inauguration next March one of the most notable in many respects that the country has ever seen.
