## CONGRESS IN SESSION

The fifty -ighth coogress of the United States met at Washington oity in ite secohd seation t twelve ó colock, noon, tóday The president of the United States will deliver at it his thaturat meseage, which with the eecompanying documents, sonheada of the repal heads of the several depart
ments wifl giod to the fi fintr ers foll and accurate stetements, in derail, of every trangaction in done in the execative, adminis' trative and juacicial departmente trative and juaicial departments
of oui kuvorumbiat. With this information before it of what has been done the last yeir by our guverament, Congress be gan ite deliberation with object of remodefing laws here hore mide, and make then conform to the conditions o The nation, in such cases as experiences ball have demonstratod the insufficiency of the old law to carry out and effectuate the prime and fundamental purpose for whioh our government was organized; "provide
for the general wellfare of the people," ahd where the conditions require it to enset new laws.
To be a miember of the Congress of the United States is no einecure. To perform the duties of that puaition requires groat induatry, ability and broad patriotism, A seanator or representative in the U. S. Con greas is under the wost sotemn fligations to regard the well-
fare of the whole. country and not uie the great power that his position gives him to especially benefit one part of the Union
to thie neglect or detriment of to the aegleet or detriment of
another. Neither can he, in conformity with the oath he hae taken, favor laws that opprose one ciass of the phople and deny toit the benefte that flow from the God "given right of equality in the life struggle for the means of exiftence.
