Bakers' Federal Buildings

Oregon's Delegation Working in Harmony for It.

Baker City Dec. 7—Baker City has good prospects of securing a substantial government appropriation for a federal building.

The site the old Houston corner of Front street one of the most prominent and valuable locations in the city has already been purchased by the government and deeds filed for record.

The Oregon delegation is working in harmony and with energy and there is little doubt that a bill will be passed carrying the appropriation at the present session of congress.

A Washington special under date of Dec. 3, says:

There is considerable talk in Washington about the probability of the passage of an omnibus public building bill at the short session of congress. With a view to securing recognition for Oregon, Senator Ful-ton today called on Supervising Architect Taylor to ascertain what amounts the treasury department will recommend be appropriated for Oregon. He was told that the department will urge the appropriation of \$100,000 for the purchase of a site and erection of a public building at Oregon City and \$85,000 for a public building at Baker City on a site heretofore purchased. If the omnibus bill is framed an effort will be made to have these appropriations incorporated.

Two thousand citizens gathered at Weiser, Idaho, to witness the formal opening to the public of the bridge across Snake river, at that place on Monday, Mayor Van Stiecklin of Weiser delivered a short address. This is the only wagon bridge across Snake River between Lewiston, Idaho, and American Falls, a distance of 500 miles. The Weiser bridge will accommodate a large section of Oregon as well as in Idaho. It is built of steel.
