The indictment, trial and con viction of four persons in the United States court at Portland recently for conspicacy to defraud the United States by procuring patent to lands by the means of perjury, forgery and false certificates of officials, will, doubtless, have a purifying effect on the mede of securing public lands, and secure the United States from future imposition, which will be very gratifying to the general public, and especially so to the U.S. officials in charge of the Land Department.
