EXCITEMENT ON STOCK EXCHANGE

Almost a Panic in some of the Stocks, but this Subsides and the Worked begins to grow Firmer.

New York, Dec. 14.—Wall street began the day today with more anxiety than shown since the May panic of 1893. The market opened weak and excited with prices generally lower. Many wild rumors were afloat and brokers generally sent out imperative calls to customers for more margins. In the pit the greatest excitement was around the Amalgamated Copper and Steel trading posts. After the demoralization of the first half hour, subsidized powerful support became manifest and there were spasmodic rallies all through the list. Copper carried three points over last night. Southern Pacific and Colorado Fuel one point, and fractional gains were established in other leading stocks. The trading was extremely feverish in the rally, but the market settled down into a quieter tone than before at 11 o'clock. The flood of selling orders caused values to tumble all along the line. Sugar, Pacific Mail, Steel common, Pennsylvanians and Union Pacific declined one half to two per cent. Amalgamated proved the strongest stock in the list opening from an eighth to a point higher. This proved the influencing factor, and caused stocks to rally and early losses were regained. The opinion prevails that the stampede caused by Lawson's advertisements is over.

MOTION OVER- RULED

Portland, Dec. 14—Judge Bellinger, after hearing arguments today in the land fraud cases, overruled the contention of the defendants that they would be put twice in jeopardy and declared that there was no reason why the second trial should not proceed. The defendants argued that as they were convicted last week for defrauding the government of public lands in township 117, and as the present case was based on alleged frauds in Oregon, it was virtually two prosecutions for the same offense. A selection of a jury for the second trial will begin tomorrow.

We Are Growing

There is nothing that speaks the continued growth of a city as the new additions that are constantly being placed on the market.

During the past year there have been several additions entirely sold out and within the past two months two more have been plotted and lots are for sale.

These two last additions show that the demand for real estate is not confined to one portion of the city but in all directions. The O'Connor addition is now on the extreme east and the Gaugloff addition just placed on the market by the La Grande Investment Co. is in the extreme western part of the city. But will soon be settled with many nice homes.
