# OREGON AT THE FAIR

Received Prizes in Various Departments.

**Agriculture**—(Including one gold medal for Dairy.) 1 Grand prize, 43 gold medals, 56 silver medals, 222 bronze medals.  
**Horticulture**—2 grand prizes, 7 gold medals, 84 silver medals, 34 bronze medals.  
**Fish and Game**—4 gold medals, 9 silver medals, 1 bronze medal.  
**Mining**—4 gold medals, 1 silver medal, 10 bronze medals. (Petition pending for grand prize.)  
**Forestry**—5 gold medals, 2 silver medals, 2 bronze medals.  
**Education**—1 gold medal, 3 silver medals, 2 bronze medals.  
 86 head of sheep sent by the Baldwin Sheep & Lamb Co., won 31 premiums, divided as follows: Rambouillet 15, Delaine 7, Spanish 6. They exhibited the largest and the heaviest shearing Spanish ram ever seen in this or any other country, but was refused a prize as the judges called him a freak. Value of exhibit about \$1,000.  
 Chas. E. Ladd, received on a herd of 12 shorthorns—2 1st prizes, 1 2nd prize 1 3rd prize, 2 4th prizes, 2 5th prizes.  
 Wm. Riddle of Polk county was awarded 2nd prize (\$100) on five head of Kent sheep. 2 1st and 1 4th on four Angora goats.

**Impeachments**  
 The House of Representatives having found articles of impeachment against Judge Charles Swayne of Northern District of Florida U. S. Senate will now act as trial court. This is the 8th impeachment trial as follows:  
 1798—William Blount, United States Senator for Tennessee, charged with inciting Indian troubles along the Lower Mississippi, acquitted.  
 1803—John Pickens, United States District Judge for New Hampshire, charged with drunkenness and profanity on the bench and making unlawful decisions, convicted.  
 1805—Samuel Chase, Justice of the United States Supreme Court, accused of misconduct in political trials, acquitted.  
 1830—James H. Peck United States District Judge of Missouri, charged with misconduct, acquitted.  
 1862—West H. Humphries, United States District Judge for Tennessee, charged with organizing rebellion.  
 1868—Andrew Johnson, President of the United States, charged with violating laws of Congress, acquitted.  
 1876—Wm. W. Belknap, Secretary of War, charged with accepting a bribe, acquitted.
