"THE CHRIST OF THE ANDES"

On the summit of the Andes, at the boundary between Chili and Argentine is a gigantic monument or statue. It is known as "the Christ of the Andes." It has been made of the metal from many bronzes cannon, that were melted up for the purpose. For nearly a century, border wars and insurrections have wasted the South American States.

Recently, as has already been stated in the Christian Herald, the leading men of Chili and Argentine began to realize the folly and wickedness of this continual strife, and they came together at a conference and decided that peace and amity should prevail hereafter. A solemn compact of peace was entered into and the nations interested gave their approval.

The great statue stands at an elevation of 14,000 feet above the sea level. It is twenty six feet in height. It rests on a granite pedestal, symbolizing the world, upon which is an inscription reading, "These mountains shall crumble to dust ere Argentine and Chili break the peace which, at the feet of Christ, the Redeemer, they have sworn to keep."—Christian Herald
