is weak. There is a shortage of tame
geese and turkeys and the demand is
good and prices strong.

The egg market is weak, but there
are no changes in quotations. Al-
though the receipts are not very large,
yet there is no outside demand.

The Onion market is firm but an

from \$2.10 to \$2.25 per hundred, though
the latter price is exceptional.

Fancy Burbank potatoes are in good
demand and the prices are firm.
The wheat market remains quiet and
quotations are unchanged.
