Robert U Rountree, of this city, is the club's funny man, and a most excellent choice has been made in his case. He has composure, good stage ad ress, and genuine mirth in his makeup. Nothing finer in recent years than his "Peter Gray" has been heard here by college boys. The mandolin club boys played well, and their selections struck a popular chord.
