ORDINANCE NO. 300
Series 1904

An Ordinance granting to the La Grande Water Storage Company (a private corporation) and its successors, and assigns, the right and privilege, for a period of thirty years, to erect and maintain poles, and other apparatus, and to place thereupon wires, conductors and other appliances and to lay under ground such wires and appliances for the transmission of electricity and electric currents and power for operating and furnishing electric lights, telephones, electric motors and other electric power, in, over and under the streets, alleys, thoroughfares and public highways within the City of La Grande, Union County, Oregon and to exercise the right and privilege of so operating and furnishing electric lights, telephones, electric motors and electric power within said City.

Section 1:—The City of La Grande, hereby grants to the La Grande Water Storage Company, its successors and assigns, the right and privilege to place, erect, lay, maintain and operate in the streets, alleys, avenues, thoroughfares and public highways in said City poles, wires and other appliances, apparatus and conductors for the transmission of electricity and electric currents for electric lights, telephone system, electric power and other lawful uses therewith connected, such wires or conductors as may be strung or fixed upon poles and other fixtures to be suspended not less than thirty feet above the ground where the same shall cross any street, alley or public highway, and not less than thirty feet at any other place within the city (except in houses, buildings, stations and storages) or such wires and appliances may, at the option of the grantee of this franchise, its successors and assigns be laid under ground in pipes, conduits and such other ap-

paratus to be used as may be necessary and proper to operate and maintain the same in an efficient and safe manner.

Section 2:—It shall be lawful for the La Grande Water Storage Company, its successors and assigns to make any and all needful and proper excavations in any of the streets, alleys, avenues, thoroughfares and public highways within the City of La Grande, for the purposes of erecting and maintaining poles or other supports for said wires or other conductors or for the repairing of the same or for the purpose of laying down, maintaining and operating said wires, apparatus or other conductors and storage stations under ground and for repairing the same, said work to be done in compliance with the necessary rules, regulations, ordinances, ordinances or laws and laws of said city which are now in force or which may be enforced during the continuance of this franchise, passes or adopted from time to time by the said City of La Grande, and the said work shall be done in a proper and safe manner and to the satisfaction of said City.

Section 3:—That whenever the said La Grande Water Storage Company, its successors or assigns in the operation of its property under this franchise, shall disturb any such streets, alleys, avenues, thoroughfares or public highways, it or they shall restore the same to as good order and condition as they were just prior to the time of being so disturbed and as soon as practicable, and without any unnecessary delay or within such time as the Council of said City may direct by resolution or order, and failing to do so, the said City of La Grande shall have the right to fix a reasonable time within which said repairs and restoring of said streets or thoroughfares so disturbed shall be completed, and upon failure of such repairs being so made by the said grantee of this franchise, its successors or assigns, the City of La Grande shall cause such repairs to be made at the expense of the said La Grande Water Storage Company, its successors or assigns, and such expense shall be paid by said grantee of this franchise or its successors or assigns to be a lien upon the property thereof.

Section 4:—That the franchise and the rights and privileges herein contained, are granted to the said La Grande Water Storage Company, its successors and assigns upon the express condition and consideration that for the purposes of its government and convenience the said City of La Grande shall have the right and privilege to attach and maintain upon the poles placed by said grantee in the exercise of its franchise over the streets and thoroughfares as aforesaid, and if such wires as aforesaid are placed underground, to use any and all wires which the City may require for fire alarms or police or telegraph service free of charge to said City.

Section 5:—The rights and privileges and franchise herein granted shall continue and be in force for a period of thirty (30) years from the passage of this ordinance, providing: (1) said grantee shall perform and comply with the conditions herein above expressed and (2) that in case the said grantee herein, its successors or assigns shall fail or refuse to operate said system for a period of six months continuously, this franchise shall be forfeited.

Section 6:—That the said La Grande Water Storage Company its successors and assigns shall not be exempt during the construction of said system and the maintenance and operation of the same, for all damages arising from the neglect of said grantee such successors and assigns or the employees thereof, in such construction, maintenance, or operation thereof and shall safely protect and guard all the excavations and

Series of 1904.

works so made in the construction, maintenance and operation of said system against injury to persons and property both to the City and to the public.

Section 7:—That the rights, privileges and franchise herein granted shall be subject to, and liable to cancellation by proper action of the Council of the City of La Grande, unless said La Grande Water Storage Company shall commence the installation of their said Electric Light Plant, within one year from date of passage of this ordinance, and prosecute work on the same with reasonable rapidity and diligence.

Section 8:—That in case any person shall desire to move any building across any street, or alley, of the City of La Grande, over which said La Grande Water Storage Company have strung wires as in this ordinance provided and it shall be necessary to remove the wires in order to permit such building to be so moved, the said La Grande Water Storage Company shall upon twenty four hours notice by the Street Superintendent, remove said wires, at its own expense. In case said Company shall neglect or refuse to remove said wires after said notice, then the Street Superintendent may remove the same and the expense thereof shall be a lien against the said property of said La Grande Water Storage Company.

Section 9:—This ordinance shall be published in the La Grande Evening Observer, for one issue thereof, published in La Grande, Oregon, and shall be in full force and effect from and after 31st day of December, 1904.

Passed by the Council of the City of La Grande, Union County, Oregon, this 21st day of December, A. D. 1904 by six councilmen voting therefor.
