FOLSOM CONVICTS ATTEMPT ESCAPE

They are Instantly Killed by the Guards and Four Others Wounded.

Folsom, Cal., Dec. 31.—In a break for liberty by convicts made at the state penitentiary yesterday afternoon the following convicts were shot and killed:
H. C. Hill of Placer county, under a sentence of 36 years for robbery.
J. Quinlan of San Francisco, serving 12 years for robbery.
W. Morales of Marin county, under sentence for robbery.
The following wounded will probably die:
D. Kelley of San Francisco, serving a sentence of eight years for robbery.
E. Quezada from Los Angeles, serving a life sentence for murder.
W. P. Fenley from Mendocino county, serving a life sentence for murder.
Slightly wounded:
Charles Carson from Marin county, serving life sentence for robbery.
Three hundred and twenty-five convicts were engaged at the rock crusher under guard of Captain Murphy and four other attaches. The attention of the guards was called to the crusher as

it stopped, some one of the convict having thrown a sledge hammer into it immediately a number of the convicts seized Captain Murphy, Guards Jolly and Taylor, and rushed out with them towards the gates brandishing large knives.
The convicts were very bold as they approached Guard Harris, who stood ready to act according to the standing orders to shoot regardless of consequences. When within 40 feet of the outside guard, one of the convicts gave the command, "Hand out your gun or we will stab Murphy to the heart."
Instead of giving up the gun Harris shot the convict dead and then began firing at the others. He was quickly joined by other guards all shooting. Warden Yell ran to the scene ordering all convicts to the prison. In the fray "Rough House" Kelly, a notorious convict, threw Captain Murphy to the ground, attempting to hide under him, but was shot by Harris.
