ANOTHER RANGE WAR

Prineville Or Jan 4—Crook county is again in the throes of a range war between cattle and sheepmen. Sunday night masked men killed 500 sheep of a band belonging to S W Smith of Paulina, about six miles east of here, and scattered and wounded the remainder of the herd of several hundred animals.

There was but one man in charge of the herd. He was suddenly confronted by six men, all of them wearing masks that concealed their faces, ordered to make no resistance, blindfolded and hurriedly driven from the camp. The slaughter at once begun, the six men firing volley after volley into the frightened mass of sheep. After killing and scattering the entire band, the six men disappeared and their identity and whereabouts is unknown, although conjectures are made as to their identity.

The herder was handling Smith's sheep on Grindstone creek and immediate vicinity, and no trouble was expected on these grounds since the recent action of the stock association.
