Tae reaction has already set in many who signed the petition through gisrepresentation of those sent out by Union, asking to have a county seat are now ready to sign a remonstrance, for the reason they have care fully considered the question and have arrived at the logical conclusion that instead of deriving a benefit by such a change it simply means increased saxation.

Suppose we cut off the territory petitioned for comprising the territory of North Powder, Hot Lake, Cove and Union. The Union people stoutly ms ntain that within the boundaries one hird of the taxable property of the entire county is embraced. Admixing that to be true the new county would only have a basis of credit to the extent of there taxable property which would be about \$1,300,000. As Union county is now in debt in excess of \$200,000 and if we use the figures circulated by the Union people during the county seat campaign it is in excess of \$250,000 put on a debt basis of 200,000 the new county taking one-third of all the property would also have to sesume one-third of the \$200,000 debt which would place it in debt for this source at the outset to the tune of \$67,000.
