Bounty Frauds

Salt Lake, Jan. 17.—Frauds aggregating \$17,000 are alleged to have government of Salt Lake and adjoining counties during the last three months through duplicate payments of bounties on the hides of wild animal pelts. In connection with the frauds Charles Jones has been arrested at Ogden and today D. B. Davis, formerly a deputy in the county clerk's office in this city was taken into custody. Other arrests are reported to have been made. The frauds were made public by a system of plugging the holes punched in the scalps by the county clerk first paying the counties.

F. Augustus Heinze and various associates are accused by plaintiff companies of misappropriating ores at Butte, in value to \$1,800,000.

Billings Mont., has the smallpox, and is quarantined. There have been several deaths, and the town is shut against all comers and none are allowed to leave it.

Rev. E. W. D. Congregationalist is dead at Forest Grove, aged 74 years. He had lived in Oregon 52 years with the exception of several years as pastor at North Yakima.

Grant's Pass is said to be growing more rapidly than any other town in Oregon. The sale of stamps during December was \$200 greater than during December a year ago. A city free delivery is probable next summer.

The National Bank of Nevada (at San Francisco) has been absorbed by the Wells-Fargo Express Co. It is believed to be a detail in the general scheme of the express company to control or own outright a bank in every commercial center.
