**TO AMEND LOCAL OPTION MEASURE**

Salem, Or., Jan. 18—Representative Jaynes of Wasco introduced this afternoon the long expected bill amending the local option law. Many important amendments are offered, the chief being a provision that an election on the prohibition issue may be called in any precinct only on petition of 40 per cent of the registered voters. It also provides that the law shall not be applicable to precincts in incorporated towns except residence precincts and shall not apply to the sale of liquor by wholesalers. Under the provisions of the bill 10 per cent of the voters in any county which adopted prohibition last November may demand the re-submission question in June, 1908. Emergency is declared so as to prevent the submission of the bill to popular vote under referendum. The bill eliminates county prohibition and provides only for precinct prohibition.

**Will Bolt Caucus Nominee**

Jefferson Mo Jan 18—It is authoritatively stated that enough republicans will bolt the caucus nominee and will bring about the defeat of Neidringhaus for the United States senate to succeed senator Cochrell, on joint ballot. The Kenens faction is leading the fight against Neidringhaus.

**Sutherland Elected**

Salt Lake, Jan. 18—Former Congressman George Sutherland today was elected United States senator to succeed Thomas Kearns, receiving the full republican vote in both houses of the legislature, voting separately. Wm. H. King, former congressman, received the six Democratic votes.

**To Resume Work**

Work on the Mormon tabernacle will be resumed in a very short time. Yesterday the contract was let to L. Billings and Colin McKinzie for the additional stone work and they will begin cutting stone the first of next week. The contract for the brick work has not been let yet but soon will be. When this building is completed it will be one of the finest structures in Eastern Oregon.
