Special Services at Presbyterian Church

The Bible reading was as usual, interesting and well attended, on yesterday afternoon. The subject was "Consecration."

The evening services were full of God's spirit. It was the best meeting, the crowning meeting of the week, and the house was packed. People are awakening in response to God's call. Never had Mr. Needham's tender words of pleading seemed so precious and yet penetrating, as last night.

Scripture reading was John 12-47 Luke 9:58. "Jesus Christ came to save. That is the greatest historical fact. For 33 years he lived here, then was crucified, buried, and arose and ascended into heaven. Why did he come to this earth? The Bible teaches us that there is no righteousness in any man. We are all depraved in the sight of God. But Jesus Christ came for a purpose. Every child of God may know what that purpose or mission was. It was a four-fold mission. He came to declare unto us, God the Father. In the Book of Revelations he declares God's love to us. John 3:16. Jesus came to roll back the veil. We were shut out from God unless Jesus came. But through the grace of God he has revealed himself unto us, and we may know him as he is.

"The rending of the veil of the temple is typical of the death of Jesus Christ. He came to us to reveal God the Father.

"Eph. 2:18. If you have not the imputed righteousness of the Son of God, he will reject you.

"Jesus came to make us rich. God knows that there are too many selfish Christians today. Selfishness is the root of all evil. Too many attend theatres, and if asked to give the same

amount of money, to missions, would think it impossible. Couldn't spare it. Too many hold onto the almighty dollar, until they make the eagle scream.

We want to be rich in grace. Jesus can make us so. He was rich, but he became poor that through his poverty we might become rich.

"We were paupers and bankrupts and the great Captain came and rescued us, gave us grace here and glory in heaven. He gave us these riches. Jesus came to put away sin, by the sacrifice of himself, and to make us glad. We have no merits of our own. We depend on God, and we are all standing on his merits.

"But he will receive you, just as you are, in all your sins, if you will only accept him as your Saviour. He has never rejected any man, and will save you.

"He came to seek and to save that which is lost. Tonight there is a stranger here. He has been to see all of you. He is waiting to see you all. He is the Blessed Son of God. "He is waiting your answer. Will you open the door and bid him enter? Don't trifle with him friends! You can trifle with man, but don't trifle with God.

TO PRACTICE OSTEOPATHY

Senator Brownell Introduces a Bill Licensing the Profession

Following are the chief sections of senate bill No 120, introduced by Senator Brownell, licensing graduates of osteopaths in the state of Oregon; A bill for an act to regulate the practice of osteopathy in the state of Oregon, and to provide for a state board of osteopathic examiners, and to license osteopaths to practice in this state, and punish persons violating the provisions of this act.

Be it enacted by the legislative assembly of the state of Oregon, be it enacted by the people of the state of Oregon;

Section 1. That any person practicing osteopathy in this state shall possess the qualifications required by this act.

Sec 2. The Governor of the state shall appoint a board of examiners as soon as possible after the passage of this act, to be known as the state board of osteopathic examiners. This board shall consist of five (5) qualified practicing resident osteopaths each of whom shall be a graduate of a legally authorized college of osteopathy. Each member of said board shall serve thereon for a term of two years and until his successor is appointed, except in case of the first board, on which two (2) members shall serve for two (2) years and three (3) years, as specified in their appointment. In case of a vacancy by death or otherwise, there shall be appointed in like manner a person to serve through each unexpired term.

Sec 3. Said board of osteopathic examiners shall elect a president, secretary and treasurer, and shall have a common seal, and its president and secretary shall have power to administer oaths. Said board shall hold meetings for examination at the state capitol at such other place as the board may select, on the third Friday of March and September of each year and such other meetings as may be deemed necessary, each session thereof, not to exceed two days, and shall issue a certificate of qualification to all applicants having a diploma, and

who shall pass the required examinations as provided by section four (4) of this act, said certificate shall be signed by the president and secretary of said board, and attested by its seal, and shall be conclusive as to the rights of the lawful holder of the same to practice osteopathy in this state. Said board shall keep a record of all its proceedings and also a register of all applicants for a license together with his or her name and age and time spent in the study and practice of osteopathy, and of the name and location of the college of osteopathy from which said applicant holds a diploma, and shall keep a register which shall show the names of all applicants licensed or that are rejected under this act.

Sec 4. It shall be unlawful for any person to practice osteopathy in this state without a license from said board. All persons practicing osteopathy within this state prior to the passage of this act and holding a diploma from a legally authorized college of osteopathy, of good repute, may be licensed to practice osteopathy in this state by submitting to said board of osteopathic examiners such a diploma, and satisfying such board that they are the legal holders thereof, and by undergoing an individual examination in the following branches, to-wit: Anatomy, physiology, chemistry, histology, pathology, gynecology, obstetrics and theory and practice of osteopathy, and such other branches as the board shall deem advisable.

Sec 5. The license provided for by this act shall not authorize the holder thereof to give or prescribe drugs for internal use nor to perform major surgery.
