## New Logging Roads

Three new logging roads have been surveyed and will be built in the immediate future. One will run from Mill City into the Lane County timber, another starting from Rainier will tap the Fox Creek Valley and the third will extend from Perry in o Eastern Oregon. The Mill City road is an extension of the Corvallis and Eastern Railroad and is being built by the Curtis Lumber Company and will run seven miles into the timber.

Preliminary work is under way for the line up Fox Creek tapping the the rich Nehalem Valley. Contracts have been secured for 100,000,000 feet of timber principally red fir. The line will eventually be extended to the Nehalem Valley. All of these roads will eventually be used for the development of the country.—Oregon Booster.
