The additional wives, he stated, are Mrs. Lena Hoch, of Milwaukee, Wis.; Mrs. T. O'Connell Hoch of Milwaukee and Mrs. Bartels Hoch of Cincinnati, Ohio. In speaking to the officers Dr. Hoch said: "It is all foolishness about this poison business at Cincinnati. Mrs. Bartels Hoch died of kidney trouble. Of course the neighbors talked about the war, the funeral was conducted, because they did not have anything else to do."

Washington, Feb. 10—Governor Davis of the Panama Canal zone has made a report in which he states there is no dangerous outbreak of yellow fever. Only a few cases have been reported and of these but six have been fatal. The disease is being mastered, and in the meantime the work of sanitation is being pushed vigorously. There is little doubt the American authorities will be as successful as they were in Havana in stamping out the disease and creating conditions under which it cannot readily gain a foothold.
