Payrolls build cities.

La Grande enjoys the largest pay rolls of any city within the Inland Empire and as we are to have an abundance of cheap electric power, the pay rolls will increase.

The Chicago Tribune expresses the opinion that the new senator from Washington, Mr. Piles would seem to be the right man to act in conjunction with Mr. Stone of Missouri, on a good roads committee.

There is a splendid opening in this city for a commercial college. Students under present conditions from Union and Wallawa counties are compelled to go abroad to receive a business education.

There should be some effort made to secure a hospital in this city. It is needed, not only needed but would be a paying investment. The Catholics have successful hospitals in a number of cities in the Inland empire, Baker City, Pendleton, Walla Walla, and Colfax. It is possible that the members of that church of this city might secure one here.

Peddlers in the northwest will earn all the money they get if the proposed legislation of the merchants of Idaho, Oregon and Washington becomes a law at this session of the legislature. A bill for the licensing and restricting them has been introduced in the Idaho and Oregon legislatures and will be presented to the Washington legislature in a few days.

The good road movement is being seriously considered by the citizens of this county. The demand is growing so rapidly that our county court will be compelled to arrange for a more extensive plan than now employed. It means much to the farmer whether he can haul from 4000 to 6000 pounds to market or whether he can hardly get there with 1000 pounds.
