**WILL FILED FOR PROBATE**

The will of the late Hon. J. M. Church has been filed with the county court for probate. The will and the petition are both now matters of public record and are with the county clerk. The will was dated October 8, 1904 and was filed with the county court Feb. 8, 1905, just five months to a day from the time it was executed. The will names but two legatees, his son W. J. Church and Miss Jean McDonald. W. J. Church receives the entire estate which is valued at sixty five thousand dollars, with the exception of one thousand dollars which is bequeathed to Miss McDonald upon condition that she is not married within one year from the time of his death. W. J. Church is named as the executor of the estate to serve without bonds. The will is witnessed by F. L. Meyers and C. H. Finn. In the petition asking that the will be admitted to probate the value of the estate is given at sixty five thousand dollars and the various properties are listed as follows:  
Two dwellings in the city of La Grande \$2,400; Eighty acres of land in Union county \$2,000; Promissory notes \$35,000; Stock in the La Grande National Bank \$12,000; Hotel and livery barn in La Grande \$14,000.

It is a book of 533 pages in which are descriptions and remedies for nearly every ailment that effects domestic animals.
