Pullman, Wash., has reorganized its fire department. The membership of the force has been down to 15, and they will be paid \$2.50 each for every fire alarm to which they respond.

Thomas Connell was killed by being run over by an engine and cars at Warren, Or. The coroner's jury returned a verdict of suicide, the evidence showing that he deliberately threw himself across the track.

Fred Lenders, while drunk at Warren, Idaho, attempted to shoot Marshall Decker, but managed to shoot himself in the hip, the ball ranging downward into the knee, inflicting an ugly and dangerous wound.

J P Mitchell, a former Spokane broker, has been sentenced at San Francisco to the penitentiary for holding up the officials of the Central Grain and Stock Exchange of that city and robbing the office of \$7000 last September.

At Post Falls, Idaho, five tons of powder belonging to Nelson Bennett, a contractor, caught fire and burned, together with the house on the island in which it was stored. It ignited from a hot stove in which fire had been banked to keep the powder warm.

During the month of January the Spokane free employment agency (run and salaried by the city) secured employment for 30 skilled laborers, 147 unskilled laborers (male) and 57 women. In all, 273 men and 91 women applied for employment. This is the record of the first month of the bureau's existence.
